i.6 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and

(e) “the Act” means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
- (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,

1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The National Economic Development and Labour Council (Nedlac) is a statutory body that was established through Nedlac Act No. 35 of 1994 and operates under the terms of its own Nedlac Constitution. Nedlac's vision is to promote growth, equity and participation through social dialogue.
- 1.2 Nedlac has one office nationally with an employee compliment of +-50 and external stakeholders/social partners. Before the Covid19 pandemic, an average +- 60 people would use the facilities on a daily basis. The office is situated at 14A Jellicoe Avenue in Rosebank, Johannesburg.

2. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVE

- 2.1 Nedlac requires services of a reputable and experienced service provider with expertise in security alarm monitoring and armed response services to provide security alarm monitoring and armed services for Nedlac House for a period of thirty-six (36) months.
- 2.2 The objective of this exercise is to ensure provision of adequate security for the Nedlac House.

3. EXISTING SECURITY EQUIPMENT

- 3.1 The current security equipment comprises of an approximate number of the following:
- a) 3 x security alarm keypads.
 - b) 27 x passives.
 - c) 13 x door contacts.

- d) 4x outdoor beams.
- e) Electric fencing on the east side of the building and some parts of the front area of the parameter wall.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

4.1 The service provider is required to provide the following services over a thirty-six (36) month period:

- a) 24/7 security alarm monitoring and armed response services.
- b) Assess and replace existing faulty security equipment, i.e. door contacts, passives, beams, etc., to ensure full operation.
- c) Record, investigate and report security incidents within specified timeframes.
- d) Detect and report security breaches.
- e) Supply and use SABS approved equipment and wiring.
- f) Installations should be in line with required safety practices compliant to the installation of such equipment.

4.2 Service provider to attend a **compulsory site visit scheduled for the 30th August 2023 at 12h30 -13h00** prior to quoting.

4.2 Service provider to issue Nedlac with warranty for work done and guarantee on spare parts and related components installed.

5. REQUIREMENTS OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

5.1 The successful service provider must meet the following mandatory requirements:

- a) Have experience and professional understanding of security alarm monitoring, armed response services, security equipment supply and installations.
- b) Provide proof of **up to date** accreditation with SAIDSA and PSIRA.

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- c) Provide proof of **at least** five (5) years relevant work experience in providing 24/7 security alarm monitoring, armed response and security equipment supply and installations.
- d) Provide **at least** five (5) reference letters with contactable references for similar projects completed in the last five (5) years.
- e) Provide Nedlac with a plan outlining the project deliverables, timelines and projected costs.
- f) Provide a company profile.

6. SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTS

6.1 In addition to the requirements of 5.1 above, service providers must submit the following documents:

- a. Detailed budget indicating the maximum amount for the project.
- b. Proof of CSD registration.
- c. Completed SBD forms.
- d. BBBEE certificate or affidavit.

7. EVALUATION AND SELECTION CRITERIA

7.1 Evaluation Criteria

7.2.4 Bidders must be ready and available to commence work immediately after appointment.
